THE CHALLENGES FOR 2016/17

There are plans for the government to change how we to safeguard and protect childre<u>n.</u>

The local authority, police and health will develop plans, which protect the most vulnerable children in the community.

KSCB will ensure that these agencies deliver these plans and services for children continue to improve in Knowsley.

WHAT HAVE WE DONE THIS YEAR?

- There have been real improvements in safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children in Knowsley.
- We developed a multi-agency safeguarding hub (known as a MASH).
- Children who may be at risk of harm are now quickly identified and helped.
- The numbers of children who go missing has reduced.
- 1,800 secondary school pupils took part in a survey to get their views on issues such as domestic abuse, sexual exploitation and substance misuse. This identified their concerns which are now our priorities.
- We are supporting children in Knowsley who have witnessed domestic abuse.
- Training on a number of different issues has been delivered to a wide range of professionals representing the KSCB.

 Identifying and supporting children who are neglected is a key priority for the KSCB.
